## **Summer Reading Themes**

You will be asked to reflect on your reading of *Persepolis* and *Of Beetles and Angels* in essay format. To help you prepare for this portion of your summer reading assessment, take some time to review the following questions as we will be discussing them in class prior to writing your essay response.

Thinking about thematic ideas presented in the story:

- How do individuals take responsibility for their actions in times of conflict?
- To what extent do you see fear as a controlling factor in people's lives?
- How do we form our beliefs in life? Are they set in stone, or constantly changing?
- What does it take to go from being a child to an adult?

On Friday, you will write your essay in class. You may use YOUR copy of *Persepolis* and *Of Beetles and Angels*. No sharing texts. You will need to reflect on your reading of both texts and think about how do Marjane and Mawi deal with fear in their daily lives?

## **REVIEW:**


In order to prepare for the essay, we are going to use the space below to jot down examples, including page numbers and quotes, of how each of these writers deal with fear.
